Highlights from the February Dinner Meeting

The OPA's February Dinner guest speaker was Daniela Kratchounova. Kratchounova, Ph.D., is a Research Scientist at the Federal Aviation Administration's (FAA) Civil Aerospace Medical Institute (CAMI). She earned her doctoral degree in

Applied Experimental Human Factors from the University of Central Florida. Dr. Kratchounova has 25+ years of experience in the aviation industry including training and instructional technology. Before her tenure at the FAA she previously worked for Gulfstream Aerospace and Honeywell International. Kratchounova is also a native Bulgarian.

Kratchounova's research interests include aviation weather human factors (image-based visibility, pilot decision-making in adverse weather avoidance), advanced vision systems (Enhanced, Synthetic, Combined Vision Systems), head-up and head-worn displays, non-traditional multimodal controls (gaze, voice, touchless gesture, touch), and future flight deck design.

At present Kratchounova is working on a new Pilot Reporting, or PIREP, program. PIREPs are reports submitted by pilots that describe observed in-flight weather conditions. PIREP's provide pilots with timely and critical weather reporting that pilots use for flight planning and while in flight to learn about weather patterns and









conditions they may enter over the course of their flight. Realtime weather reports allow pilots to avoid dangerous weather conditions increasing safety in flight.

In its current form PIREPs are given to air traffic controllers and then relayed by those same controllers, who a re also responsible for updating a PIREP database.

Controllers are often too busy with other tasks to take these PIREP reports.

Highlights from the February Dinner Meeting

Kratchounova and team have spent the last two years developing a cloud-based computer system to record and relay PIREPs to pilots negating the need for air traffic controllers in the process.

Kratchounova and her team wanted to do this through a dedicated frequency for these reports and secured the old Flight Watch frequency that was decommissioned in 2017; 122.0 MHz. In their developments they built a computer based PIREP program that allows pilots to report real-time weather reports using natural speech. Pilots no longer will be required to use dated "pilot" language to report weather events. They simply report what they are witnessing while in flight in everyday language.

As a part of the "proof of concept" they are currently testing the program in two 50 radial mile areas of the country; Oklahoma City, OK (KOKC) and Nenana, AK (PANN). Pilots flying in those areas can use the system to report and retrieve PIREPs and those that are enrolled can actually get paid \$50 per occurrence for relaying and retrieving PIREPs from the system.

To participate in the program you can register at cbtopsatcami.faa.gov. The website will walk you through the reporting


and retrieving process as well as allow you to register for your own participant number to be paid for your efforts. As a participant you will be asked to fill out a bimonthly survey about using the system. The system is in TESTING and prone to errors and the survey will be your way to communicate the experience, good or bad, with Kratchounova and her team.

If her program is successful her hope is to secure 122.0 MHz to be used across the country for all pilots, GA and professional, to secure accurate and real time weather data. Her current proof of concept testing program runs through April 30, 2023.




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


March 11 OPA Fly Away to Atoka, OK Reba's Place - Wheels Down: 10:00 am


