

Speaker: Kent McInnis

Kent McInnis earned his Air Force pilot wings in 1971 at Laredo AFB, Texas, with a class proudly named the Rio River Rats, an homage to the "real" River Rats who risked their lives

flying missions over North Vietnam. His first assignment was to return to Laredo AFB as an instructor pilot in T-37 jet trainers. His job was to introduce and solo student pilots in their first jet aircraft. Students, after learning the difficult task of instrument flying, could experience the more enjoyable parts of flying—aerobatics and formation. Because half of the instructor pilots were returning Vietnam combat veterans, Kent collected their stories as well as his own in film, photos, and journals. These are the sources for the realistic and entertaining works of historical fiction Kent McInnis brings to his readers.

SIERRA HOTEL, the first of a three-novel series, looks at the Vietnam War from the perspective of airmen in the rear echelon dealing with a different enemy—dysfunctional commanders, war protestors, and personal demons, while supporting a war

their leaders are unwilling to win. Books 2 & 3 are CLEAR and a MILLION and SEMPER FLY. Look for TALES of the RIO RIVER RATS in 2025.

Speaker: Lt Col David McCullum

Lt Col. David McCollum currently serves as Oklahoma Wing Chief of Staff and Government Relations Advisor. McCollum joined Civil Air Patrol in 2008 while living in Texas, fulfilling a long-time interest in the organization. His impetus for finally joining the all-volunteer auxiliary of the U.S. Air Force was the highly publicized search for Steve Fossett, which heavily involved CAP.

McCollum served Texas Wing in various capacities, including unit, group and wing public affairs officer, and unit deputy commander for seniors, all while becoming a qualified search and rescue mission pilot. After transferring to Oklahoma Wing in 2014, McCollum served as wing public affairs officer, wing director of emergency services, and commanded the Oklahoma City Composite Squadron. Under his leadership, the unit lost fewer members during the COVID-19 pandemic than any other unit in Oklahoma Wing (less than 14 percent when the wing and national average was in the 20+ percent range).

He graduated from Southwest Region Staff College at Kirtland AFB in 2017 and was named outstanding student. McCollum graduated from CAP's National Staff College at Maxwell AFB in 2019.

McCollum is a senior mission pilot with more than 2,000 hours of flight time, mission check pilot, senior incident commander and holds numerous other emergency services qualifications. He holds master ratings in public affairs and emergency services, with senior ratings in operations and several other specialty tracks. He is an instructor for CAP's Volunteer University, the organization's professional development schoolhouse.

He is a graduate of the University of Oklahoma and currently resides in Oklahoma City.


Warren moved the family from Wellington to Guthrie, Oklahoma when Vicky was 7 years old.



The October OPA Fly Away is scheduled for Beaumont, KS to eat at the historic Beaumont Hotel and Restaurant. The Beaumont Hotel was created in 1879 as a stagecoach and railroad stop to shelter weary pioneers... when the railroad brought cattle barons and frontier society to Beaumont.


Surrounded by lush native grass, the hotel nestled deep in the Flint Hills became a magnet for cattle buyers visiting the surrounding big spreads. As the nation grew, so did aviation; in 1953, a 2,600-foot north and south native grass airstrip was carved out of the prairie so airplanes could taxi right up to The Beaumont Hotel's front door.

The airport designator is 07S. Wheels down for lunch will be 10:30 am. The north/south runway is listed at 2400' and is a grass strip, but I was told it is in good shape. To get to the restaurant, taxi to the south end of the runway and take the road west to the restaurant. Aircraft parking is along the south side of the road.
