Speaker: Dr. Matt Vance

Dr. Vance holds a PhD in Aviation Science from Saint Louis University. He was the Oklahoma State University Senior Professional Pilot faculty representative responsible for academic classes covering aviation: Human Factors, Crew Resource Management (CRM), Law, Ethics, FAR §141 PVT/INST/COMM/MULTI ground school, Space Science and Safety.

The March presentation will involve "Title - FAA 5 Critical Decision Points/N9815L Are you familiar with Ch-2 of the Pilot's Handbook of Aeronautical Knowledge (FAA-H-8083-25C), Aeronautical Decision Making (ADM)? Buried within the discussion of the 5-P checklist are the FAA's 5 critical decision points a pilot faces on every flight. We will discuss them and then apply the decision points to a Fight Service Station (FSS) audio recording of a real-life, near-tragic incident. This discussion lesson was always one of the most poignant and respected by my professional pilot students at OSU."



Previous to OSU, he served as Senior Researcher/Flight Instructor for the Center for Aviation and Space at Saint Louis University. Previous industry positions included Boeing; Exchange Officer – UK Ministry of Defense in London; Director of Washington Studies and Analysis, Future Combat Systems, Air Traffic Management, and Senior Manager of Boeing Commercial Airplanes Product Strategy; McDonnell Douglas, Principal Engineer for Phantom Works Systems Assessment Division and Lead Engineer for the HARPOON missile.

His flight experience includes 5,800 hours between U.S. Naval Flight Officer, civil Pilot-in-Command / Instructor flying time. His 20-year military career includes more than 3,000 hours of patrol/submarine hunting with extensive operational experience in Pacific, Indian, Arctic and North Atlantic theaters and joint Command Center Duty Officer service at the United States Transportation Command. Dr. Vance recently retired from the faculty at Oklahoma State University.

Ary is considered one of this country's leading authorities in the history of manned space flight. Prior to coming to the Stafford Museum, Ary founded the internationally acclaimed Kansas Cosmosphere & Space Center, where he served as its President/CEO for nearly three decades. After leaving the Cosmosphere, Ary was named as the Executive Director of the Omniplex Science Center (now known as Science Museum Oklahoma) in Oklahoma City. He is credited for being involved with the development and design of nearly a dozen space and aviation museums throughout the world, including his work with General Tom Stafford in the creation of the Stafford Museum in the early 1990's. Ary has served as a technical advisor on numerous space-related movies, including the Academy Award winning production "Apollo 13" and the Emmy Award-winning TV miniseries, "From the Earth to the Moon." He has made numerous appearances on the "Today Show," "Good Morning America," "CBS Morning News," the History Channel, and the Discovery Channel, to provide expert commentary regarding spaceflight happenings. He has led numerous projects to save thousands of priceless and historic space artifacts from destruction, including the expedition to find and recover the "Liberty Bell-7" Mercury spacecraft from more than 16,000 feet below the Atlantic Ocean, and the complete restoration of the actual Apollo 13 Command Module "Odyssey." He has served as a space education technical advisor to more than 50 museums and institutions around the world, including NASA, the Smithsonian Institution, Disney, and the Russian and South Korean



governments. For his work, Ary has been awarded numerous national and international awards, including the Triebech Trophy for Aerospace Design, the National Non-Profit Young Executive of the Year, and is one of the only Americans ever awarded the "Gagarin Medal" by the Russian Federation of Cosmonautics. In 1994, he was named to the "Kansas Aviation Hall of Fame."

Remembering Lt. General Thomas P. Stafford A True Pioneer in Air and Space

It is with great sadness that the Oklahoma Department of Aerospace and Aeronautics shares the passing of a true pioneer in air and space exploration, Lt. General Thomas P. Stafford (USAF, ret.). General Stafford, the esteemed namesake of the Oklahoma Stafford Air & Space Museum, passed away on March 18, 2024, in Indian Harbor, Florida, at the age of 93.

General Stafford's remarkable journey began in Weatherford, Oklahoma, where he was born on September 17, 1930. A proud "Weatherford Eagle," he credited his hometown as the foundation for his extraordinary life. After graduating from Weatherford High School in 1948, he pursued his dream of becoming a fighter pilot, graduating from the U.S. Naval Academy in the top 1% of his class. His dedication led him to transfer to the newly formed United States Air Force, where he excelled as a test pilot and later as an astronaut.

During the height of the Cold War, General Stafford played a pivotal role in the Space Race, flying in four historic space missions, including Gemini 6, Gemini 9, and Apollo 10. He was one of only 24 humans to venture into deep space and explore another celestial body. Following his space career, he continued to serve his country, leading efforts in aerospace development and serving as a key advisor to multiple U.S. presidents.

General Stafford's legacy extends far beyond his achievements in space. He was a visionary who believed in the power of collaboration, as evidenced by his instrumental role in fostering cooperation between the U.S. and Russia in space exploration, helping to pave the way for the end of the Cold War.

As we mourn the loss of a true hero, let us also celebrate General Stafford's enduring legacy and the countless lives he touched. Our thoughts and prayers are with his family, including his wife Linda and their children and grandchildren.

In honor of General Stafford's memory, let us continue to reach for the stars and embrace the spirit of exploration and discovery that he embodied throughout his remarkable life.

What first got you into flying? Roger has always had a love for flying... His first flight was in a V-Tail bonanza at age 12. What have been some of your favorite flights? Branson... Jan (Roger's wife) and he love to go to Branson because it is a nice flight and there is a lot to do there.








Is Jan a pilot too?


Highlights from the OPA March Dinner Meeting


